# SUMMARY of CHANGE

AR 25-70 Troop Program Sequence Number

This Change 1--

- o Corrects the title of positions 4 and 5 of the troop program sequence number (TPSN) for nondivisional units to "sequence number" (sec I).
- o Clarifies the use of element sequence (ELSEQ) numbers and restricts the use of ELSEQ numbers to divisional and armored cavalry regimental units only (master units, less school troop brigades) (sec I, paras 5b and 5c).
- o Provides new table 1 to reflect changes (sec II, table 1).
- o Provides updated table 5 that better reflects organizations currently in the force. (sec II, table 5).
- o This publication --
- o Updates troop program sequence numbers (TPSN) to align the second and third positions of nondivisional TPSNs with standard requirement codes (SRC) to facilitate unit identity (throughout).
- o Updates element sequence numbers to current Army force structure (throughout).

**History.** This publication was originally published on 5 January 1998, authenticated by Togo D. West, Jr. Secretary of the Army. This printing publishes Change 1, 18 July 2000, authenticated by Joel B.

Hudson, Administrative Assistant to the Secretary of the Army.

**Summary.** This regulation defines policies used and the structure of troop program sequence numbers (TPSN). TPSNs are used for grouping major units and like units together for information retrieval.

**Applicability.** This regulation applies to the Active Army, Army National Guard, and the U.S. Army Reserve.

Proponent and exception authority. The proponent for this regulation is the Deputy Chief of Staff for Operations and Plans (DCSOPS). The DCSOPS has the authority to approve exceptions to this regulation that are consistent with controlling law and regulations. The proponent may delegate this authority, in writing, to a division chief within the proponent agency in the grade of colnameonel or the civilian equivalent.

Army management control process.

This regulation contains management control provisions, but does not identify key management controls that must be evaluated.

**Supplementation.** Supplementation of this regulation is prohibited unless prior approval is obtained from HQDA (DAMO-FDF), 400 Army Pentagon, Washington, DC 20310-0400.

**Suggested Improvements.** Users are invited to send comments and suggested improvements on DA Form 2028 (Recommended Changes to Publications and Blank Forms) directly to Headquarters, Department of the Army (DAMO-FDF), 400 Army Pentagon, Washington, DC 20310-0400.

#### Section I Introduction

#### 1. Purpose

This regulation—

- a. Describes the procedures in the use and structure of the troop program sequence numbers (TPSN).
- b. Describes the TPSNs for current and planned organizations of the Army by using approved codes for all designations for tables of organization and equipment (TOE) and tables of distribution and allowance (TDA) organizations.

#### 2. References

Required and related publications are listed in appendix A.

#### 3. Explanation of abbreviations and terms

Abbreviations and special terms used in this regulation are explained in the glossary.

#### 4. Responsibilities

- a. Deputy Chief of Staff for Operations and Plans (DCSOPS). The DCSOPS has primary responsibility for promulgation and assignment of TPSNs to all Army elements.
- b. Chief, Force Management and Integration Division, Office of the Deputy Chief of Staff for Operations and Plans (ODCSOPS). Headquarters, Department of the Army (HQDA) (DAMO-FDF) has responsibility for the TPSN program. Major Army commands (MACOM) submit requests for assigning, changing, and/or correcting a unit TPSN to HQDA, ODCSOPS, ATTN: DAMO-FDF, 400 Army Pentagon, Washington, DC 20310-0400.

#### 5. Use and structure of troop program sequence number

- a. The TPSN is a code that groups units by mission, type, and size. The TPSN is an instrumental tool in data retrieval in the Structure and Manpower Allocation System (SAMAS) and other selected automated reporting systems in the Army. The structure of the TPSN is shown at table 1.
- b. For TOE units, the TPSN has five basic positions. The TPSN positions group units by category (position 1), type (position 2), and master unit number (positions 3 through 5) or by category (position 1), TOE branch (positions 2 and 3), and sequence number (positions 4 and 5).
  - (1) Divisional and separate brigade/regimental units.
- (a) The first position identifies category (0 for division; 1 for brigade, command, or regiment; or 8 for school troop brigades, see table 2).
  - (b) The second position identifies type of organization (0 through 9, see table 3).
  - (c) The third through fifth positions identify the master unit number.
  - (2) Nondivisional units (echelons above division (EAD)/echelons above corps (EAC)).
  - (a) The first position identifies category (see table 2).
  - (b) Positions 2 and 3 identify the TOE branch (see table 4).
  - (c) Positions 4 and 5 are used for the sequence number.
  - c. Examples of TOE TPSN are shown below.
- (1) Divisional, TPSN "01082." First position "0" identifies the category as division (table 2); second position "1" identifies the type as airborne (table 3); third through fifth positions "082" identify the master unit number. In this example, TPSN "01082" represents the 82<sup>d</sup> Airborne Division.
- (2) Nondivisional, TPSN "20604." First position "2" identifies the category as nondivisional combat (table 2); second and third positions "06" identify the TOE branch as field artillery (table 4); fourth and fifth positions "04" identify the sequence order.
- d. For TDA units, the five-position TPSN groups organizations by category (position 1, see table 2); special class code (position 2, see table 6); activity code (positions 3 and 4, see table 7); and sequence order (position 5). Augmentation TDA to MTOE units will have the same TPSN as the unit it augments. All derivative unit identification codes (UIC) will have the same TPSN as their parent unit. Examples of TDA TPSNs are shown below:
- (1) TDA, TPSN "46551." First position "4" identifies the category as supporting forces (table 2); second position "6" identifies the special class code as other activities (table 6); the third and fourth positions "55" identify the activity code as installation support services (table 7); and the fifth position "1" is used for sequencing. In this case, TPSN "46551" could be used to identify the Headquarters, U.S. Army Garrison at a U.S. Army Training Center.
- (2) TDA augmentation, TPSN "01082." TDA augmentation units carry the same TPSN as the MTOE unit they augment. In this case, TPSN "01082" is used to identify a TDA augmentation to a MTOE unit in the 82<sup>d</sup> Airborne Division.

- e. The element sequence number (ELSEQ) is a two-digit number (see table 5). It is assigned to certain master units providing a means of grouping like units together by certain categories.
- (1) ELSEQ numbers are prescribed for units organically assigned to master units. To achieve a standard automated display of units having the same ELSEQ, the unit number and Combat Arms Regimental System (CARS) number will be used. The sort sequence should be by TPSN, ELSEQ, UNMBR, and CARS.
- (2) The ELSEQ is used in master units to identify types of units, since all units carry the basic TPSN of the master unit. The following example illustrates the TPSN for a divisional master unit, TPSN "00001" and ELSEQ "10." First position "0" of the TPSN identifies the category as a division (table 2); second position "0" of the TPSN identifies the type as a cavalry division or brigade (table 3); third through fifth positions "001" of the TPSN identify the master unit number—the 1st Cavalry Division. ELSEQ "10" identifies military intelligence (MI) (table 5). In this case, TPSN "00001" and ELSEQ "10" identifies the MI communication-electronic warfare and intelligence (CEWI) battalion in the 1st Cavalry Division.

#### (3) (Rescinded.)

- f. A sequence order number is assigned to TDA TPSNs (position 5) as a management tool for separating TDAs by function, thus enabling a more accurate data retrieval capability. Do not confuse this number with the ELSEQ.
  - g. For special class code, the following apply:
- (1) TPSN assigned to training divisions are peculiar to these divisions and are not constructed using the standard TPSN number for master units. For TOE units, the second position of TPSN is used to identify Reserve training forces. A "1" in the second position is assigned to Reserve training brigades and organic unit(s). Unit number of training divisions will appear in third, fourth, and fifth positions. For example, in TPSN "61080" the first position "6" identifies training forces; second position "1" identifies Reserve brigade; third, fourth, and fifth positions "080" identify unit number.
- (2) For TDA units, the second position is used for special class codes (see table 6); the third and fourth positions are TDA Unit Activity Codes (see table 7); the fifth position is used for sequencing. For example, in TPSN "59957" the first position "5" identifies the category as special activities (table 2); the second position "9" identifies the special class code as civil and reimbursable functions (table 6); the third and fourth positions "95" identify the TDA Unit Activity Code as activities not otherwise classified (table 7); and the fifth position "7" is used for sequencing. In this case, TPSN "59957" could apply to JUSMAG-K, as an example.
- h. As long as a unit's mission or basic capabilities in a branch remain the same, the TPSN will not change. Reorganization of a unit to a later TOE series alone does not require a TPSN change. The latest published TOE number, series, and year are used in the TPSN. Units organized under an earlier TOE series will use the TPSN shown for the latest series. The TOE number and date under which a unit is currently organized will be shown until reorganization under the latest TOE number and date is effected.
- *i.* Units organic to divisions, brigades, or school troops (TPSN first position 0, 1, or 8) will report the TPSN of the respective division, brigade, or school troop unit.
- *j.* Branch designation associated with the heading "TOE Branch Type Unit" has been correlated with those in AR 71-32 for standardization. Subordinate elements of a parent unit will carry the branch designation of the parent unit.

#### Section II

#### **Codes and Element Sequence Numbers**

#### 6. Category

The first position of the TPSN groups units, activities, and personnel by their primary mission generally, according to section I of the TOE or TDA. However, HQDA (DAMO-FDF) may change the first position of the TPSN of any unit from 3 through 9 to a first position of 2. This is done when a particular unit should be classified as nondivisional combat. These changes should be coordinated with HQDA proponent agencies. Codes are shown at table 2.

#### 7. Branch code

- a. For master units (categories 0, 1, and 8), the second position of the TPSN defines the type of TOE organization. Codes are shown at table 3.
- b. For other than master units, the second and third positions of the TPSN define the type of TOE organization. Codes are shown at table 4.

#### 8. Unit level codes

Unit level codes (ULC) at table 8 are provided as a ready reference only. (See Joint Pub 1-03.3 for use of ULC.)

Code Description

- Divisions. TOE units and augmentations to TOE units assigned to combat divisions. USAR divisions (training) are listed under first position 6 of the TPSN
- Brigades, commands, regiments. TOE units and augmentations to TOE units organically assigned to separate maneuver brigades, commands, or regiments.
- 2 Nondivisional combat. Units organized to perform a tactical combat mission.
- 3 Support to combat forces. Units that have the primary mission of providing support to the combat forces or units that are a part of a theater command or task force formed for combat operations.
- 4 Supporting forces. Units and elements that have the primary mission of performing other support functions not part of combat forces.
- 5 **Special activities.** Units and elements that have the mission of handling international, joint, liaison, diplomatic, political, research, or recreational and morale activities provided for the benefit of the Army or the Armed Forces.
- 6 Training forces. Units or activities engaged in training and personnel being trained.
  - a. Trainers. Units organized to provide training for, or advice to, units or individuals; units organized to provide essential administrative support to schools, training centers, and other training activities.
  - b. Trainees. Enlisted members assigned to training centers and other miscellaneous training activities for initial entry military occupational specialty training. Includes processing and en route time to, and between, training activities and follow-on training.
  - c. Students. Personnel taking courses of instruction in excess of 22 weeks at formal Army service schools, schools of the other Services, joint colleges, allied schools, and civilian instruction. Includes initial entry training for officers.
- 7 Transients, patients, and prisoners. Personnel not charged to the authorization of a TOE or TDA organization.
  - a. Transients. Trained personnel on travel, proceed, leave en route, or temporary duty (TDY) en route status while on permanent change of station (PCS) orders between duty stations.
    - b. Holdees.
      - (1) Patients. Persons assigned on PCS basis to medical holding detachments.
  - (2) *Prisoners.* Persons dropped from the assigned strength of an operational or training unit and confined in a military detention facility after a court-martial sentence. Includes persons assigned to correctional training facilities for motivational and behavioral rehabilitation.
  - (3) *PCFs*. Persons assigned to personnel control facilities (PCF) pending disposition from their cases. Includes returned from dropped from military control status.
    - (4) Separatees. Persons assigned to a separation transfer activity for discharge or separation from active duty.
- 8 School troops. TOE units required at certain installations (primarily those with a Service school) to provide training support, excluding Army training centers and professional schools in category 6.
  - a. Brigades. TOE units and augmentation to TOE units originally assigned to separate brigades.
  - b. Nondivisional. Organized tactical combat units. Units organized with a tactical combat capability that provide training support.
  - c. Support. Units that provide training support, but normally have the primary mission of providing support to the combat forces, or that are part of a theater, command, or task force formed for combat operations.
- 9 Control groups. Personnel or units not provided for in categories 1 through 8, including Army Reserve control groups.
